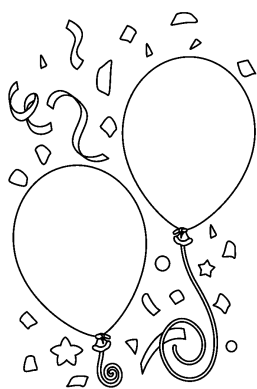

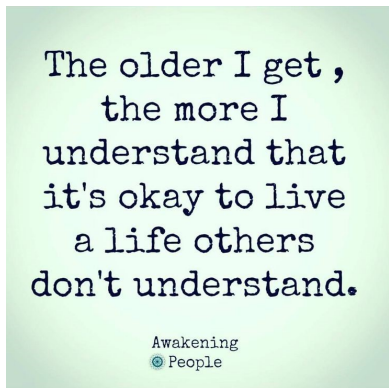

## NO BAKE CHOCOLATE OATMEAL COOKIES

This is a very simple recipe that kids love to have a hand in making and taste fantastic.

### INGREDIENTS

- 2 cups white sugar
- 1/2 cup butter
- 1/2 cup milk
- 3 tablespoons cocoa powder
- 3 cups quick cooking oats

- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

### DIRECTIONS

1. Mix together sugar, butter or margarine, and milk in a sauce pan.
2. Bring to a boil and boil for one minute, stirring constantly.
3. Remove from heat and mix in cocoa, quick oatmeal and vanilla.

4. Drop on to waxed paper using a teaspoon.
5. Let sit until set and enjoy.
