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CANNABIS LEGALIZATION IN ALBERTA

Cannabis has been legal for years in Canada for medicinal use, with a prescription from a doctor, however, on October 17th, 2018, cannabis will be legal for recreational use as well.

While every province is different, you should know what it means for Alberta.

Know The Rules.

1. You must be 18 or older.
2. All cannabis must be purchased from a licensed retailer or at albertacannabis.org.
3. You may carry only 30 grams at a time on your

person.

4. You cannot smoke in public places - these limits are set locally, contact your local au-



thority.

5. You cannot drive high - the amount of time you need to sober up will be different for everyone, so be careful.
6. Just like alcohol, cannabis will need to be secured in closed packaging, and out of reach of anyone in

the vehicle. If you are pulled over for any reason, and police see cannabis stored improperly in your vehicle, you could be arrested and searched, and you could face a fine.

7. Edibles are not yet legal to sell.

8. No one under 18 years of age is allowed to enter a store that sells cannabis - even with a parent or guardian.

This legislation will also allow adults to grow a maximum of 4 plants per household, NOT per adult.

These plants MUST be grown indoors, and have no access by anyone under the age of 18.

Keep yourself informed, know

Know The facts!

Yes, there is a roadside test for cannabis. In addition to the standard sobriety test, there is a saliva test that will determine the THC levels in your body.

The proposed legal limit will be less than 2 nanograms (ng) of THC per millilitre of blood.

The penalties for amounts of cannabis between 2 and 5 ng will begin at a \$1000 fine.

Over 5 ng, or a combination of THC and alcohol, will result in a \$1000 fine, loss of license, seizure of vehicle, and up to 120 days in jail for repeat offenders.

The maximum penalties

would be two years less a day on summary conviction (up from 18 months), and to 10 years on indictment (up from 5 years).

The limits of THC will apply regardless of whether the person has a prescription for cannabis.
